Britain's job market in the first quarter after the EU referendum

Background

On the 24th June this year, Britain made the historic decision to leave the European Union (EU).

Since the shock referendum result, there has been much talk of the impact Brexit will have on jobs and recruitment.

However, our up-to-the-minute figures show that the UK's job market has remained resilient and British employers are undeterred after the vote to leave the EU.

In the first quarter since the referendum, the Reed Job Index reports that the number of new jobs added to reed.co.uk is up 9% on the same period last year.

This report takes a deeper look into how Britain's job market has fared in the first quarter following this historic vote.


Executive Summary

- The UK job market continued to grow in the first quarter after the referendum, with jobs up 9% year-on-year
- Industrial sectors, including Motoring & Automotive (+27%) and Manufacturing (+24%), are driving annual growth for the quarter
- The sectors seeing annual declines for the quarter include Banking (-18%) and Charity & Voluntary (-15%)
- The regions benefiting the most from the boost include Northern Ireland, Wales and the East Midlands
- However, London and the South East have seen a decline for the period, compared to Q2 before the vote
- It's essential the government now gives greater clarity on its negotiating position for Brexit to underpin confidence in the jobs market

Jobs growth in the face of Brexit uncertainty

Up-to-the-minute data from the UK's largest job site, reed.co.uk, shows that the number of jobs advertised in the first quarter since the EU referendum rose 9% on the same period last year.

Overall, the Reed Job Index stands at 291 for September, up 10 points from August.



Sector growth

According to the latest reed.co.uk Job Index, industrial sectors including Motoring & Automotive (+27%) and Manufacturing (+24%) were amongst the strongest performing sectors for year-on-year growth in Q3.

Sector slow-downs

Of the sectors seeing declines for Q3, jobs in Banking (-18%) and in Charity & Voluntary (-15%) saw the biggest annual contractions following the announcement of the referendum result.

The regional picture

Across the country the picture is positive, with all regions seeing annual jobs growth between July and September. Northern Ireland (+50.6%), Wales (+21.5%) and the East Midlands (+16.2%) were the regions reporting the biggest growth in vacancies.

However, London and the South East have both seen a drop in the number of vacancies on offer in Q3 when compared to the previous quarter, with a fall of -2.8% and -4.3% respectively.



Commentary

James Reed, Chairman of reed.co.uk comments:

"The UK jobs market is continuing to show resilience in the face of ongoing uncertainty over what Brexit will actually look like.

"We've seen a record number of new jobs available on reed.co.uk this week after strong annual growth throughout Q3. Clearly, British businesses have held firm and continued with their plans to recruit.

"The biggest growth has been seen in the Motoring & Automotive, Manufacturing and Retail sectors, perhaps driven by the lower exchange rate.

"However, Banking and Finance continue to decline and this is having an effect on growth in London and the South East.

"It's essential the government now gives greater clarity on its negotiating position for Brexit to underpin confidence in the jobs market. Business leaders are already working hard to counter the potential impact of leaving the EU and they must know that the government is listening."
